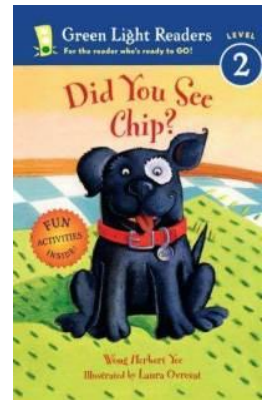


Did You See Chip? by Wong Herbert Yee
